## Peter Caswell

It was with great sadness that we learned that Peter passed away peacefully at home last Saturday 28th October. He had been cared for devotedly by Delia since returning from hospital. It was lovely that Rev Katharine was able to be with them and support Delia at the end. Our thoughts and prayers remain with Delia and the family at this difficult time.

Peter was a local lad, brought up on the "flat tops" at Mee Brow, and was proud of being the first person from there to go to university. He and Delia first got to know each other travelling by bus into Manchester. He was raised in the Roman Catholic faith, and they were married at St Lewis's in Croft, but he became very much involved in the life of Glazebury Methodist Church and subsequently became an active member there. I remember many years ago he was instrumental in setting up a joint Culcheth and Glazebury drama group which led to several memorable productions. Amongst many other activities he chaired the Property Committee and organised the annual Auction with great energy, also acting as a distinctive auctioneer.

Everything Peter did was carried out with commitment, energy and enthusiasm. He was one of the most genuinely caring people I have known but was also prepared to stand up and take action. You will recall his tremendous commitment, along with Delia, to the Phakamisa Project in South Africa and I remember his and Delia's unbounded joy when the apartheid regime in South Africa ended and Nelson Mandela became President. His commitment to local politics as an active member of the Labour Party is well known. He was a Parish Councillor, as was Delia, as well as an election agent, and Borough Council and parliamentary constituency candidate.

I have many fond personal memories of Peter: the warmth of his friendship, his dry wit, calmly reading his newspaper in the midst of noisy activity - he was very deaf! He was a great character who will be sorely missed by all. Farewell and rest in peace, my good friend. David Ogilvy
